**Mark is published in the Office Journal**

In these situations the mark is published in the Office Journal for 3 months. Your mark will be published on 27/10/2017 and other parties may oppose your mark within 3 months of the publication date.

**When is your mark protected?**

If no opposition is filed or no extension of time to oppose is filed, your mark will be protected in New Zealand once 6 months has passed from the date we were notified of the designation. This is to ensure that we are able to take into account any marks we receive after your designation that claim convention priority or have an earlier international registration date than your mark.

**What happens if an opposition is filed?**

If a notice of opposition is filed you will be notified. In order to take further part in the opposition procedures, you will need to provide an address for service in New Zealand and any documentation you wish to submit must be filed via the Commissioner's website at [www.iponz.govt.nz](http://www.iponz.govt.nz).
