Discussion of provisional full refusal. This is a provisional full refusal of the request for extension of protection to the United States of the international registration, known in the United States as a U.S. application based on Trademark Act Section 66(a). *See* 15 U.S.C. §§1141f(a), 1141h(c).

The referenced application has been reviewed by the assigned trademark examining attorney. Applicant must respond timely and completely to the issue(s) below. 15 U.S.C. §1062(b); 37 C.F.R. §§2.62(a), 2.65(a); TMEP §§711, 718.03.

SEARCH OF USPTO DATABASE OF MARKS

The trademark examining attorney searched the USPTO databaseof registered and pending marks and found no conflicting marks that would bar registration under Trademark Act Section 2(d). 15 U.S.C. §1052(d); TMEP §704.02.

However, the applicant should note the following refusal and requirements:

SECTION 2(e)(1) REFUSAL - MERELY DESCRIPTIVE

The applied for mark is 'PRO SHIFT' in International Class 012 for "Bicycles, including electric bicycles; parts, fittings and accessories for bicycles, including electric bicycles, namely, hubs, derailleurs, cranks, crank sets, front chain wheels, electric motors for bicycles."

Registration is refused because the applied-for mark merely describes a feature and characteristic of applicant's goods. Trademark Act Section 2(e)(1), 15 U.S.C. §1052(e)(1); see TMEP §§1209.01(b), 1209.03 et seq.

A mark is merely descriptive if it describes an ingredient, quality, characteristic, function, feature, purpose, or use of an applicant's goods. TMEP §1209.01(b); see, e.g., In re TriVita, Inc., 783 F.3d 872, 874, 114 USPQ2d 1574, 1575 (Fed. Cir. 2015) (quotingIn re Oppedahl & Larson LLP, 373 F.3d 1171, 1173, 71 USPQ2d 1370, 1371 (Fed. Cir. 2004)); In re Steelbuilding.com, 415 F.3d 1293, 1297, 75 USPQ2d 1420, 1421 (Fed. Cir. 2005) (citing Estate of P.D. Beckwith, Inc. v. Comm'r of Patents, 252 U.S. 538, 543 (1920)).

Generally, if the individual components of a mark retain their descriptive meaning in relation to the goods, the combination results in a composite mark that is itself descriptive and not registrable. *In re Fat Boys Water Sports LLC*, 118 USPQ2d 1511, 1516 (TTAB 2016) (citing*In re Tower Tech, Inc.*, 64 USPQ2d 1314, 1317-18 (TTAB 2002));TMEP §1209.03(d); see, e.g., *In re Cannon Safe, Inc.*, 116 USPQ2d1348, 1351 (TTAB 2015) (holding SMART SERIES merely descriptive of metal gusafes); *In re King Koil Licensing Co*, 79 USPQ2d 1048, 1052 (TTAB 2006)(holding THE BREATHABLE MATTRESS merely descriptive of beds, mattresses, box springs, and pillows).

Only where the combination of descriptive terms creates a unitary mark with a unique, incongruous, or otherwise nondescriptive meaning in relation to the goods is the combined mark registrable. *See In re Colonial Stores, Inc*, 394 F.2d 549, 551, 157 USPQ 382,384 (C.C.P.A. 1968); *In re Positec Grp. Ltd.*, 108 USPQ2d 1161, 1162-63 (TTAB 2013).

In this case, both the individual components and the composite result are descriptive of applicant's goods and do not create a unique, incongruous, or nondescriptive meaning in relation to the goods and/or services.

"FREE" is defined in part as: "Unobstructed; clear."

"SHIFT" is defined in part as: "To change (gears), as in an automobile."

Thus, the combined wording "FREE SHIFT" describes a mechanism used to change gears that operates in an unobstructed manner.

Further, the attached evidence from third-party websites others shows others using the wording "FREE SHIFT" used in a descriptive manner with bicycles and their parts.

Based on the above, registration is refused under Trademark Act Section 2(e)(1).

Although applicant's mark has been refused registration, applicant may respond to the refusal by submitting evidence and arguments in support of registration. However, if applicant responds to the refusal, applicant must also respond to the requirements set forth below.

INFORMATION REQUEST

Due to the descriptive nature of the applied-for mark, applicant must provide the following information and documentation regarding the goods and wording appearing in the mark:

- (1) Fact sheets, instruction manuals, brochures, advertisements and pertinent screenshots of applicant's website as it relates to the goods and/or services in the application, including any materials using the terms in the applied-for mark. Merely stating that information about the goods and/or services is available on applicant's website is insufficient to make the information of record.;
- (2) If these materials are unavailable, applicant should submit similar documentation for goods of the same type, explaining how its own product or services will differ. If the goods feature new technology and information regarding competing goods is not available, applicant must provide a detailed factual description of the goods. Factual information about the goods must make clear how they operate, salient features, and prospective customers and channels of trade. Conclusory statements will not satisfy this requirement.; and
- (3) Applicant must respond to the following questions:
 - Do applicant's competitors use "FREE" to advertise similar goods? If so, please explain.
 - Do applicant's competitors use "SHIFT" to advertise similar goods? If so, please explain.
 - Do applicant's competitors use "FREE SHIFT" to advertise similar goods? If so, please explain.
 - What is the significance of "FREE" in connection with applicant's goods?
 - What is the significance of "SHIFT" in connection with applicant's goods?
 - What is the significance of "FREE SHIFT" in connection with applicant's goods?
 - Who is the typical consumer of applicant's goods?

Failure to comply with a request for information is grounds for refusing registration. *In re Harley*, 119 USPQ2d 1755, 1757-58(TTAB 2016); TMEP §814.


