This is a **PROVISIONAL PARTIAL REFUSAL** of the request for extension of protection of the mark in the above-referenced U.S. application that applies to only the following goods in international classes 6 and 15:

Class 6 – Common metals and their alloys; metal sheets; iron and steel; and steel alloys (unwrought or semi-wrought).

Class 15 - (music); lutes [musical instruments]; and pegs for musical instruments.

See 15 U.S.C. §1141h(c). See below in this notification (hereafter "Office action") for details regarding the provisional partial refusal.

The referenced application has been reviewed by the assigned trademark examining attorney. Applicant must respond timely and completely to the issue(s) below. 15 U.S.C. §1062(b); 37 C.F.R. §§2.62(a), 2.65(a); TMEP §§711, 718.03.

NO CONFLICTING REGISTERED MARKS

The trademark examining attorney has searched the Office's database of registered and pending marks and has found no conflicting marks that would bar registration under Trademark Act Section 2(d). TMEP \$704.02; see 15 U.S.C. \$1052(d).

SUMMARY OF REFUSAL(S) / REQUIREMENT(S):

• Identification of Goods - International Classes 6 and 15

Although the examining attorney has not refused registration, Applicant must respond to the following requirement(s) set forth below.

IDENTIFICATION OF GOODS - INTERNATIONAL CLASSES 6 AND 15

The identification of goods is indefinite and must be clarified. See TMEP §1402.01.

In particular, for international class 6, Applicant must provide greater specificity with regard to, "Common metals and their alloys", "metal sheets", "iron and steel", and "steel alloys (unwrought or semi-wrought)."

Please note that while "steel alloys" is acceptable and "steel alloys, unwrought or semi-wrought" is acceptable, because the "(unwrought or semi-wrought)" in the identification is in parentheses it may be deleted during Office processing leaving "steel alloys" by itself and the identification of goods may not contain duplicative entries. See TMEP §§707.02 and 1402.12. The USPTO generally uses brackets to indicate goods and/or services that have been deleted from registrations. See id. Applicant must remove the parentheses from the identification and incorporate any parenthetical information into the description of the goods.

Also, please note that entries found in the U.S. Acceptable Identification of Goods and Services Manual designated as a "trilateral entry" (T) are acceptable only when adopted in its entirety.

For international class 15, Applicant must provide greater specificity with regard to, "(music)", "lutes [musical instruments]", and "pegs for musical instruments."

International class 40 is acceptable as written.

Please note that failure to address this issue shall result in all specified indefinite terms being deleted from the identification. For Applicant's convenience, all indefinite terms and phrases, and corresponding corrections suggested by the examining attorney, have been highlighted.

International class 15 -

Musical instruments;

Idiophones;

Percussion instruments;

String instruments;

Musical instruments, namely, lutes;

Dampers for musical instruments;

Tuning pegs for musical instruments;

Strings for musical instruments

NOTE: An applicant may only amend an identification to clarify or limit the goods, but not to add to or broaden the scope of the goods. 37 C.F.R. §2.71(a); see TMEP §1904.02(c)(iv). In an application filed under Trademark Act Section 66(a), the scope of the identification for purposes of permissible amendments is limited by the international class assigned by the International Bureau of the World Intellectual Property Organization (International Bureau). 37 C.F.R. §2.85(f); TMEP §§1402.07(a), 1904.02(c). If an applicant amends an identification to a class other than that assigned by the International Bureau, the amendment will not be accepted because it will exceed the scope and those goods and/or services will no longer have a basis for registration under U.S. law. TMEP §§1402.01(c), 1904.02(c).

In addition, in a Section 66(a) application, an applicant may not change the classification of goods from that assigned by the International Bureau in the corresponding international registration. 37 C.F.R. §2.85(d); TMEP §§1401.03(d), 1402.01(c). Further, in a multiple-class Section 66(a) application, an applicant may not transfer goods from one existing international class to another. 37 C.F.R. §2.85(d); TMEP §§1401.03(d), 1402.01(c).

RESPONSE GUIDELINES

For this application to proceed toward registration, applicant must explicitly address each refusal and/or requirement raised in this Office action. If the action includes a refusal, applicant may provide arguments and/or evidence as to why the refusal should be withdrawn and the mark should register. Applicant may also have other options for responding to a refusal and should consider such options carefully. To respond to requirements and certain

refusal response options, applicant should set forth in writing the required changes or statements.

If applicant does not respond to this Office action within six months of the issue/mailing date, the following goods will be deleted from the application:

Class 6 - Common metals and their alloys; metal sheets; iron and steel; and steel alloys (unwrought or semi-wrought).

Class 15 - (music); lutes musical instruments; and pegs for musical instruments.

See 37 C.F.R. §2.65(a); TMEP §718.02(a). The application will then proceed with the following goods and services only:

Class 6 – Steel sheets; Timplate; Unwrought or semi-wrought iron; Pig iron; Alloyed iron; Non-ferrous metals and their alloys; Plated steel plates and sheets; Unwrought or semi-wrought steel; Steel in the form of sheets, plates, foils and coils; Steel plates and sheets; Steel alloys

Class 15 - Musical instruments; Idiophones; Percussion instruments; String instruments; Guitars; Dampers for musical instruments; Strings for musical instruments

Class 40 - Treatment of materials, namely, treatment of materials for the construction of musical instruments; treatment of metals; metal tempering

See TMEP §718.02(a). In such case, applicant's only option would be to file a timely petition to revive the abandoned goods, which, if granted, would allow for the reinsertion of these goods into the application. See 37 C.F.R. §2.66; TMEP §§718.02(a), 1714. There is a \$100 fee for such petitions. See 37 C.F.R. §\$2.6, 2.66(b)(1).

If applicant hires a qualified U.S. attorney to respond on his or her behalf, then the attorney must sign the response. 37 C.F.R. §§2.193(e)(2)(i), 11.18(a); TMEP §§611.03(b), 712.01. Qualified U.S. attorneys include those in good standing with a bar of the highest court of any U.S. state, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and other federal territories and possessions of the United States. See 37 C.F.R. §§2.17(a), 2.62(b), 11.1, 11.14(a); TMEP §§602, 712.01. Additionally, for all responses, the proper signatory must personally sign the document or personally enter his or her electronic signature on the electronic filing. See 37 C.F.R. §2.193(a); TMEP §§611.01(b), 611.02. The name of the signatory must also be printed or typed immediately below or adjacent to the signature, or identified elsewhere in the filing. 37 C.F.R. §2.193(d); TMEP §611.01(b).
